Policy JICFAA-Harassment, Intimidation or Bullying

Schools should maintain a safe, positive learning environment for students and a teaching environment for staff that is free from harassment, intimidation or bullying.

The policy defines harassment, intimidation or bullying. It also encourages students to report the incident and states that the complaint will be investigated promptly, thoroughly, and confidentially. The responsibility of communicating this policy to all stakeholders is also noted.

- · What are the social norms of the community and school?
- · Where do discipline problems occur?

- · Are rituals/routines clearly defined?
- · Do our procedures for reporting, ivestigating and enforcing bullying and other behaviors follow the district policies/expectations and do we clearly communicate these with all stakeholders?
- · Do we have programs in place to recognize those students who are doing the right thing?

Additional Actions Taken:

- Established and communicated rituals/routines to all staff members.
- Reviewed classroom/school rules to make sure these portray a positive learning environment.
- Established and communicated to all stakeholders the procedures for reporting bullying, etc.
- Established and communicated to all staff the procedures for investigating bullying.
- Established and communicated to all stakeholders the consequences for bullying.
- Provided information/guidance to victims (ongoing).
- Provided guidance to those who bully (ongoing).
- Recognized students who have good behavior (ongoing).
