SUBJECT:

Expansion of Community Eligibility Provision

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The District currently has 16 community eligibility provision (CEP) schools. All students at those schools are eligible for breakfast and lunch at no cost. The District wishes to expand CEP by three schools during the 2019 – 2020 school year: LBC Middle, Schofield Middle, and Mossy Creek Elementary. The 2018 – 2019 school year was the District's first year of CEP participation.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION:

Per the US Department of Agriculture, CEP is a non-pricing meal service option for schools and school districts in low-income areas. CEP allows the nation's highest poverty schools and districts to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost to all enrolled students without collecting household applications. Instead, schools that adopt CEP are reimbursed using a formula based on the percentage of students categorically eligible for free meals based on their participation in other specific means-tested programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).

CEP participation requires a four year "contract"; however, there is an escape clause that allows an opt-out. The deadline for 2019 – 2020 participation is June 30, 2019.

With the additions, CEP participation will benefit nearly half of our schools (19), including all of the Area 4 schools and thirteen of 20 elementary schools and approximately 8,000 students. The District will continue to explore CEP additions in the future.
