SUBJECT:

Application for Impact Aid (Section 8003, Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965)

BACKGROUND:

Section 8003 provides funds to school districts for students residing on or having parents working on federal property. On October 27, 2017, survey forms were distributed to all students in the District in order to determine the number of eligible students. Subsequent verification was performed and is on-going.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION:

The application is due to the U.S. Department of Education by 11:59 PM on January 31, 2018 to avoid penalty (reduction in funding). Any amendments to the application must be made by September 30, 2018.

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Superintendent to submit the Application for Impact Aid (Section 8003, Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965).
