### **Recommendation Specifics**

The committee voted unanimously (among members present) to make the following recommendation:

Due to increased community spread of COVID-19, the increased number of positive cases within schools, the risk of exposure due to increased asymptomatic spread, and the increased number of quarantines of staff and students leading to lower absence fill rate with substitutes, the committee recommends a move to the following instructional delivery models...



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#### Recommended Schedule 11/23 to 1/8:

Remote Learning week of 11/23 to 11/25

Remote Learning week of 11/30 to 12/4 (due to the risk of spread from holiday travel)

Hybrid Learning week of 12/7 to 12/11 and 12/14 to 12/18

Remote Learning week of 1/4 to 1/8 (due to the risk of spread from holiday travel)

## Possible Schedule beginning 1/11:

- \*Hybrid Learning week of 1/11 to 1/15
- \*4 day week elem week of 1/18 to 1/22
- \*Begin phase in of Middle/High as cases permit week of 1/25 to 1/29

#### Concerns we have:

- Technology issues how can we make sure students have devices in hand to use for the mixed models, also make the learning equitable for those who do not have devices or access to internet, possibly a list of services in the community that can help with technology and connectivity.
- Hybrid Learning Model- use the lessons learned to improve this process, and involve teachers in the process to best meet the needs of the students.
- Travel and potential spread, public health concerns from travel. Being a responsible community partner with our area.
- Staffing issues not being able to cover the teacher and staff absences resulting in supervision, instruction, bus transportation and school food service shortages.

<sup>\*</sup>This plan is dependent on the numbers of positive cases, quarantine and staffing issues and can be adjusted as needed.
