Emergency Plans In Place

- We have a comprehensive emergency plan that addresses threats such as weather emergencies, fire, active shooters, and utility failures
- Emergency Drills are conducted on a scheduled ongoing basis with students and staff
- Online courses, presentations, memos, and discussions are provided to staff members for training and information related to safety topics

Threat Reporting, Detection, & Assessment

- ACPSD immediately responds to any concern of a threat that could impact school safety
- Threats are communicated to Law Enforcement
- ACPSD has a formal risk assessment instrument that is used by a team of trained staff to evaluate interventions and safety measures to be enacted

Physical Security

- ACPSD is continuing to increase physical security by employing fencing, surveillance cameras, electronic access controls, vestibules, doors, gates, and door locks to keep the campuses secure
- Visitor management protocols are in place for screening using Hall Pass
- ACPSD is Security focused and utilizing a "defense in depth" approach as it continues to increase the physical security of each campus. This concept uses barriers and systems to help deter, detect and delay a potential threat

Site Assessments

Site assessments are being conducted at every school, recommendations are being made, and concerns are being addressed as resources are available.

- Vestibules
- RFID
- Cameras
- Fencing
- Door handles, locks, open campuses, mobiles etc.



School Resource Officers/ Security Personnel

- 16 of our 43 schools in the district, to include CIL, have a full time
 SRO in their school from 4 different Law Enforcement agencies
- Strong MOU's and collaborative relationships exists between LE and administrations
- All SRO's must have Basic SRO training through SC Police Academy which includes Law Enforcement, Law related education, and Law related counseling
- Knox Boxes installed for Emergency Responders access to buildings

Athletic Event Security

- Local Law Enforcement at each game
- Private Security contracted for unarmed security
- Open Gate Weapons Detectors will provide an added security measure
- Clear Bag Rule implemented



Areas of Focus

- ACPSD will continue to request state funding for SRO's to be placed at each school in the district as officers become available
- CRASE training should be offered for schools to provide for their staff



Threat Tip Line

ACPSD Threat Tip Line for community partners, students, and parents to be able to report, anonymously and after hours.



Future Initiatives

- After a campus emergency, an after-action review is being conducted to identify areas of success as well as improvements related to prevention, crisis mitigation, response, and recovery
- After a major school safety incident, the Emergency Plans and Safety Practices are being reviewed and evaluated with emergency community partners against the facts of the incident
- Moving towards being able to send and receive calls via MS Teams in the classroom
- Labels to identify doors for emergency response
- Panic buttons for key staff to notify Law Enforcement
- Safety Hall Monitor positions implemented for Elementary Schools
